- 6. After that, the teacher divides the students into groups and provide them few topic in the form of a worksheets and ask them to write a script of maximum 5 minutes .
- 7. Facilitator will monitor the whole activity and provide support if necessary.
- 8. Finally, the teacher will ask a specific group from among the different groups to dramatize their script.
